2025 CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES





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General Information

We run a varied and engaging range of subjects for students at Newton Moore SHS and encourage all parents to continue to support the school through payment of contributions and charges, as this will ensure we continue to have the capacity to provide a wide range of opportunities to our students.

Voluntary Contributions

A voluntary payment of \$235 is requested from parents and goes towards the cost of materials and equipment used by students in Years 7 – 10. Voluntary contributions are costs associated with school based resources (such as paper, specialist equipment use, chemicals, sporting equipment) that is used by multiple students and retained by the school.

Compulsory Charges

Compulsory charges are applied to high cost electives chosen by students in Years 7-10 and to all Year 11 & 12 courses. Payment of charges is compulsory. Students can select a combination of subjects that meet the maximum contribution value of \$235 and therefore do not attract compulsory charges. Compulsory charges are made up of costs directly used or consumed by the student and are often paid to external agencies to run the course (such as bus hire fees, entrance fees, guest speakers).

Extra Cost Optional Components

These are optional activities that are above and beyond normal education program. If selected, these costs are compulsory.



Payment Options

Accounts Office hours are 8.00am – 4.00 Monday to Friday. The school makes provision for the following payment options:

- In person at the Accounts Office with cheque, cash, EFTPOS or Credit Card.

- Payment plan– We encourage regular payments in instalments over the school year. Please contact the accounts office to discuss payment plan options.
- Centrepay - Free for Centerlink customers, use Centrepay to arrange regular deductions from your Centrelink payment.
- Payment for excursions can now be made using Consent to Go

Addressing Issues of Non-Payment

Newton Moore takes a positive approach to collecting contributions and charges from parents. We send regular email, SMS and other correspondence to parents to advise/remind them of;

- the benefits that arise from their payment of contributions, charges and optional extras.
- available payment options including payment plans.
- availability of financial assistance.
- the use of external debt recovery services which are utilised in the recovery of unpaid charges.

Refunds Policy - School Camps, Excursions and Incursions

Camps, excursions and incursions are carefully costed and charged to parents based on confirmed numbers of student participating. If your child withdraws from an optional activity, only the refundable component such as meals or venue entry will be refunded. Non-refundable costs such as bus or venue hire will not be refunded. If parents do not pay for the camp/excursion/incursion by the due date, students cannot attend.



Allowances

Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS)

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. Available to parents/guardians of secondary students if the parent is a holder of: Pensioner Concession Card, Health Care Card or Department of Veterans Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

The allowance consists of two components:

Educational Program Allowance \$235 paid directly to the school

Clothing Allowance \$300 paid directly to the parent or school.

How to Apply

Forms (located at the back of this booklet) are to be completed at the school in Term 1 of each year. Bring your bank details and eligible cards into the accounts office and make your application before the end of Term 1. Late applications are not accepted.

These forms can also be completed online and emailed to NewtonMoore.SHS.Accounts@education.wa.edu.au with a copy of a valid health care or concession card.

BYOD

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

It is our expectation that students from all year groups bring their own device to support their learning in our school. BYOD means you can bring an appropriate laptop or tablet to school and use it in classes and for study purposes. Students must use their devices in line with the school's ICT Resources, BYOD, Mobile Phone and Online Services Acceptable Use Agreement.

What To Buy?

Newton Moore SHS sells decommissioned school laptops to students who may not be able to afford a new computer. These are in working order and come with a charger. Prices vary depending on age but range from \$20-\$50. See the admin office to enquire or purchase a laptop.

Chromebook (any brand) is excellent value - 4GB RAM, USB/USBC, 32GB storage

Required/ Recommended Technical Specifications if Purchasing Brand New:

- Antivirus software - Required.
- Wi-Fi wireless connection - Required.
- Battery life - 5 hours - Recommended.
- USB ports - Recommended.
- Minimum screen size-at least 9.7 diagonal inches. Larger recommended.
- CPU – Intel i5 or equivalent – Minimum recommended.
- Windows 10 64bit OS with 8GB RAM or Windows 11 - Recommended.
- Minimum 256GB SSD or Hard Drive size – larger recommended.
- An external hard drive or large capacity USB Drive, so your child can back up their work from their device.

NOTE Smartphones are generally unsuitable for learning activities because of their small screen size, and are not permitted, unless directed by a staff member.

iPads are also permitted as a BYOD.

Windows Package

All students have access to a free Microsoft Office Package. Simply log into Microsoft 365 using your school student email and password.

Insurance

As personal property is not covered under the school's insurance, we **STRONGLY** recommend that any BYOD device is covered fully under your own personal house/contents insurance arrangements. When purchasing you may also wish to consider buying an extended warranty.
